

## Overview of Ohio Licensing Process for Foreign Educated Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA)

### The Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE)

PTA typically requires a two-year associate degree offered through a community college. To find an accredited program in Ohio visit <http://otptat.ohio.gov/PTPrograms.aspx>. Program entry requirements vary between institutions. Potential students should:

- Check with college admissions office to find out if proof of English proficiency is required before admission into the academic program. If so, applicant will need to take the **Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL iBT)** at any time in the process. Internet-based version - Score must be 83 or higher. The applicant needs to contact the Educational Testing Services (ETS) at 609-771-7100 or register online at [www.ets.org](http://www.ets.org). The Board must receive the test scores directly from ETS.
- Have foreign transcripts evaluated
  - **Documentation of Education:** In Ohio, college coursework completed outside the United States requires a course-by-course analysis from an approved international credential evaluation service. The Ohio Department of education is able to utilize credential evaluations from any of the following organizations:

#### Steps for Board Certification

##### Verification of Citizenship

Applicant will need to attest to one of the following:

- United States citizen
- Person lawfully admitted for permanent residency in the United States (attach a copy of the front and back of their USCIS issued registration card)
- Other non-immigrant status (attach a copy of documentation such as an I-20 and I-94)
- Foreign national not living in the United States

- Certification of Entry Level Education

- Register online at the [FSBPT website](#) and pay a registration fee of \$400.00 (fee to increase in 2019)
- FSBPT will send you an “Authorization to Test” (ATT) letter containing instructions on how to schedule an appointment with **Prometric**. You will receive your ATT letter by email at the email address you provided during registration
- Schedule examination with Prometric at <https://www.prometric.com>.

- A score of 600 or higher is needed
