"He has done everything correctly, done an impressive amount of due diligence to give his business the best chance for success," said Lankford. "He's proving that you can be a risk taker, even after retirement." The Renaissance Fine Art Supplies store is located in a newly renovated, \$12 million, historic building project. The Artspace Hamilton Lofts is one of a kind in Ohio, offering "live/work" space for 42 artists. "I have a strong desire to make my community better," said Jones. "We want to provide continued growth of the arts in this town."
