Census 2020: Responding Online

The purpose of Census 2020 is to count everyone once, and only once, in the right place. The U.S. Census Bureau counts the population by collecting basic information from every household, including those who live in group or non-traditional living arrangements.

The Census is easy, safe and important.

This year is the first time you can submit your Census information online. It typically takes 10 minutes to complete, making it easy for you to respond anytime and anywhere.

Every household will get a postcard in the mail within the next month. There will be a unique identification number written on it. When you fill it out online, you enter that number to verify that it is your information.

The U.S. Census Bureau is bound by law to protect the privacy and confidentiality of everyone who responds to the Census. Your responses are combined with other responses to produce statistical summaries. Any identifiable information about an individual or household cannot be shared for 72 years.

These protections ensure the personal information you provide cannot be used against you in any way. Your personal information will not be shared with law enforcement.

All responses submitted online and stored in its computers are encrypted. Only verified Census officials have access to this information.

This impact of this count lasts for the next 10 years, since following estimates are based on the original Census count. Let's get the count right for Ohio.
