What to Expect in the Mail

Beginning this month, every household should receive a letter in the mail to respond to Census 2020. The Census is a count of every resident in the United States, and it is everyone's responsibility to get the count right for Ohio.

Once you have the letter, you can submit your information either online, on the phone or by mail. The letter will contain a unique identifier number that you will need in order to verify your information.

Submitting your form online will be the easiest and most efficient method. Select areas will receive the paper questionnaire in the mail along with their invitation, but most households will just receive the letter.

Please fill out your Census form as soon as you can. One person fills it out for the entire household. It asks for information such as names and birthdays and typically takes around 10 minutes to complete.

National Census Day is April 1, 2020. Use that day as a frame of reference if you are split between different living areas.

Census 2020 is accessible for everyone. If you respond online or over the phone, the form will be available in more than 12 languages and has video accessibility for American Sign Language. The website is accessible to people of all abilities.

If you **miss the initial letter** in the mail, you will receive follow-up reminders and eventually a paper questionnaire. If you haven't replied by the end of April, the Census Bureau will start visiting non-responsive homes.
