

2018 Summer STEM Program

Fast Facts

- The Appalachian Regional Commission – Oak Ridge National Laboratory Summer STEM Program is a **FREE** opportunity for middle school students and high school students and teachers in Appalachian Ohio.
- The 2018 sessions will take place from July 7–20, 2018 for high school students and teachers, and July 15–20, 2018 for middle school students.
- Participants will work on a variety of real-world projects and problem-solving activities at Oak Ridge National Laboratory and Oak Ridge Associated Universities in Oak Ridge, Tennessee. Participants will also participate in field trips to nearby industries, universities and museums.
- The program is designed to encourage students who demonstrate interest in math, science and technology to follow those interests towards education and career paths they might not have considered without this opportunity.
- All major expenses, including meals, lodging, transportation to and from the participant's home, and local transportation, will be covered for all participants. Teacher participants will receive a stipend.
- Two middle school students, two high school students and two high school teachers will be selected to attend the program.
- Middle school students from the same school will be given priority in the selection process.
- High school student and teacher participants may be selected from different school districts.
- Middle school participants must be between 12 and 14 years old on July 14, 2018. High school participants must be at least 16 years old by July 6, 2018.
- Applications must be submitted to the Governor's Office of Appalachia on or before **March 16, 2018**. Applications received or postmarked after this date or submitted electronically will not be considered for the program.
