The units have a capacity of 115 households. Funds will be used for general administration and operating expenses. The program will serve 150 households consisting of 200 persons during the two-year period. The program projects that 97% percent of persons will exit to or retain permanent housing.

Bed count/HIC/HH served delineated such that it is difficult to determine which beds are dedicated to homeless populations. The award was thus reduced based upon the reported HIC. The award was further adjusted to reflect how the Lucas County project was not recommended for funding. Justification below:

The program was not recommended for funding because it is unclear if the project is targeting solely homeless populations; unit counts are inconsistent; occupancy data is inconsistent; a revised APR had to be submitted late due to the prior APR's poor data quality (i.e. it was ran for a period whereby the agency was not open for several months)
