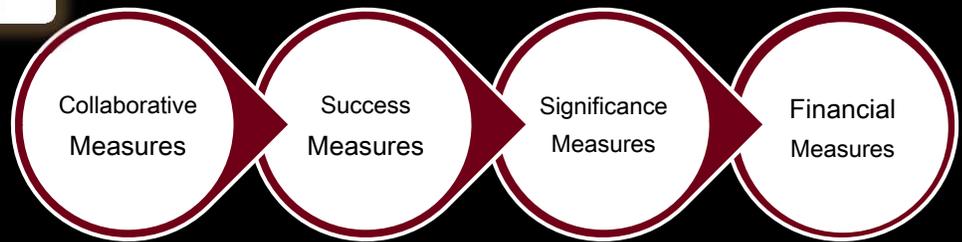





4. Program Budget – Our original application showed 6 years of budget information for Ashtabula County 911 Department. We submitted an additional exhibit showing 3 years of cost data for the PSAP locations that are outside of Ashtabula County’s budget, because we are using cost savings at the PSAP locations for our return on investment. I spoke to Nicole Bent yesterday and she said the information originally submitted was complete.
5. Return on Investment – Ashtabula County is using conservative estimated cost savings for the PSAP locations to calculate the return on investment. After speaking to Nicole Bent yesterday I have revised the Return on Investment Narrative to make it easier to understand, although Ms. Bent indicated that the original narrative justified the return on investment. The revised narrative is attached as LGIF Round5 application Ashtabula 18.
6. Resolutions of Support – A resolution from Ashtabula County Board of Commissioners and a letter of support from First Energy are included in the attachment Cure MOU.
7.
