



The 2000 annual average civilian labor force estimates for Columbiana County were: total labor force - 51,700, employment - 49,100, unemployment - 2,600, and unemployment rate - 5.1. Columbiana County ranked twenty-eighth in unemployment among Ohio's 88 counties.

Columbiana County is located in the northeast portion of the state bordering on Pennsylvania. U.S. Route 30, and State Routes 14, 39, 154, and 172 cross the county east and west, and State Routes 7, 9, 11, 45, and 170 run north and south. Little Beaver Creek flows through the county on its way to the Ohio River. At the southeast corner of Columbiana County, the Ohio River provides the border separating Ohio from West Virginia.

LMI (place of work data)




In 2000 the total employment for all industries in Columbiana County was 34,377 with the Manufacturing industry claiming the largest portion--26.8 percent. Average weekly earnings for all industrial groups in Columbiana County were \$470.95.

Attractions in Columbiana County include Beaver Creek and Guilford Lake State Parks; Log House Museum in Columbiana; Salem Museum of Historic Interest & Memorabilia; Plymouth Street Historic Area in Hanoverton; Museum of Ceramics in East Liverpool; Old Stone House Museum in Lisbon; Scenic Vista Park; Harvey S. Firestone Park; Sandy and Beaver Canal; Cherry Valley Arboretum; Morgan's Monument; six covered bridges; and the Ohio River.


DECENNIAL POPULATION GROWTH 1900 - 2000




