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POPULATION PROJECTIONS

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This data series, based on the 1990 census, covers population projections and percentage change in population for five-year intervals beginning in 2005. A population projection is a mathematical out-come based on assumptions about trends in fertility, mortality, and net migration.

Source

The Office of Strategic Research, Ohio Department of Development, produced the projections. Data used in preparing these projections came from the 1990 Census of Population, vital statistics, 1980-1990 net migration, IRS county-to-county migration flows, and annual intercensal estimates.

Frequency

The projections are updated twice each decade. This series was last updated in May, 1997.

Time Period Covered

The projection years are: 2005, 2010, and 2015.

Geographic Areas

In this report, projections are presented for the State of Ohio and the 88 counties. The larger data series includes projections for Ohio metropolitan areas, though detailed age and sex breakouts are available only for the Ohio portions of metropolitan areas. The Office of Strategic Research does not project population for areas smaller than a county.

Related Publications

The larger data series includes projections by sex and five-year age cohort (0-4, 5-9... 85+). The data are available in *Populations Projections, Ohio and Counties by Age and Sex: 1990 to 2015* (\$25). The series is benchmarked to the 1990 census. An updated set of population projections is scheduled for release in 2003.
