Dear Fellow Ohioans:

The Ohio Department of Development is pleased to publish *Ohio County Indicators*, which lists demographic and economic activity in each of Ohio's 88 counties. This publication is compiled by the Department's Policy, Research, and Strategic Planning Office, which carefully collected data from state and federal data sources and compiled the results into 49 tables.

General themes presented in this report include Population, Income, Employment, Building Permits, Property Values, and Business Indicators. Each table lists the 88 counties in Ohio and provides multiple years of data on a specific topic, allowing you to compare and contrast the performance of the diverse economic regions across our state.

As our state's largest county with respect to population, Cuyahoga County makes up 11 percent of our state's total population. By 2020, Delaware County is projected to grow by 95.9 percent from 2000. Williams County in Northwest Ohio has the largest percentage of its workforce dedicated to manufacturing at 32 percent. These are just a few of the many facts presented in this edition of *Ohio County Indicators*.

Data in the report is presented by topic, and the reader can quickly compare a county's relative position to its neighbors. In its companion publication, *County Profiles*, data is presented by geography with data for one county combined in a concise, five-page format. 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HOUSING UNIT COUNTS AND ESTIMATES

Contents

This data series covers census counts and estimates for the housing units of the state and the 88 counties. Estimates are based on the 2000 Census and the subsequent Count Question Resolution, building permit data (for demolitions as well as new construction), mobile home shipments, and estimates of housing unit loss from American Housing Survey national samples.

Source

Census housing unit counts and estimates are prepared and released by the U.S. Bureau of the Census. See the Bureau's web site <<http://www.census.gov/>>.

Frequency

The Census of Population and Housing is conducted every 10 years. Estimates are released annually.

Time Period Covered

Housing unit counts from decennial censuses cover the years 1940-2000. Estimates are for 2009.

Geographic Areas

Data in this report are presented for the state and the 88 counties. In other databases from which these were drawn, census housing unit counts are available for a wide variety of geographic areas.


