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NEW AND EXPANDING FACILITIES

Content

This table is a compilation of project counts based on announced major business expansions and attractions. The data are gathered in a year-long process of reviewing published reports appearing in newspapers and surveying state and local development agencies. Projects are then submitted to *Site Selection Magazine*, which annually publishes statistics on business attractions and expansions by state. Projects included met at least one of three criteria: investment of at least \$1,000,000, addition of 20,000 square feet of space, or 50 new jobs. Projects are further restricted to manufacturing, distribution, office, hotel, or research and development establishments. Projects are generally credited to the year in which they are announced.

Site Selection Magazine publishes state statistics in its February issue, and the Ohio Dept. of Development publishes its list of projects **submitted** to the magazine about the same time.

Time Period Covered

1998-2000.

Data in this report are presented for the state and the 88 counties. The larger database contains project information by city, village, and township.



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**LARGE MANUFACTURING ESTABLISHMENTS AND
EXPORTING MANUFACTURING ESTABLISHMENTS**

Contents

These tables present statistics derived from a directory of manufacturing establishments in Ohio. The directory frequently records the number of employees at an establishment and whether it exports its products. The first table shows the distribution of the 200 largest manufacturing establishments among Ohio's 88 counties. (The actual number is 205 because 21 reported 700 employees, the smallest number that produced at least 200 establishments.) The second table shows the distribution of all exporting manufacturing establishments among the counties. The establishments voluntarily provide this information—if they do not volunteer it, they are not included in the table. Information on export sales or volume is not available in this database.

123--PROCUREMENT

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U.S. GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT CONTRACT AWARDS

Contents

These tables present data on U.S. Government procurement contract awards for fiscal years (FY) 1994-2000. The Census Bureau obtains procurement data from the Postal Service and the Federal Procurement Data Center (FPDC). The FPDC collects data on a quarterly basis from most Federal departments and organizes these data according to the county of performance, not the location of the prime contractor. Excluded from the procurement totals are the amounts for the judicial and legislative branches, as well as intergovernmental transfers of funds.

Most contract actions provided by the FPDC with values under \$25,000 are not distributed by state and county. FPDC data represent the value of obligations for contract actions, and do not reflect actual expenditures. In general, only current year contract actions are reported. However, multiple year obligations may be reflected for contracts of less than three years duration. Contractual actions for service often not generally associated with procurement, such as the purchase of utilities and building leases, are included in the database.
