



# Youngstown

## Population




The census population for Youngstown peaked in 1930. Its population held steady for several decades then dropped through the 2006 estimate. According to the American Community Survey estimate, the population was 70,500.

## Households




In 2006 Youngstown had 28,400 households. In 1960 the number neared 49,000 households. The persons per household dropped from 3.39 in 1960 to 2.32 in 2006.

## Population by Age




Youngstown's median age of 36.3 was slightly lower than the State's 37.6 despite having a higher proportion of persons 65 and older. Nine percent of the population were aged 75 or older. The elderly population was balanced by the large school-aged cohorts.

## Demographic Characteristics




There were 7,800 families in Youngstown with children under 18. Almost 70% were single-parent households. --- There were 1,500 foreign-born persons living in the city.

## Household Income Distribution




Youngstown's median household income was \$21,900 compared to the State's \$44,500. Nearly 8% of the households received some cash public assistance. The median family income for the city was \$30,300.

## Employment by Industry




An estimated 4,900 residents were employed in health care and social assistance which accounted for 19.8% while the same sector for the State accounted for 13.8%. There were 3,900 persons employed in manufacturing living in Youngstown.

## Educational Attainment



Almost 36% of Youngstown's 44,600 persons aged 25 and older had at least some college education. Ohio had almost 50% with at least some college.


## Labor Force / Unemployment Rate




The average annual labor force grew slightly from 2001 through 2006 to 32,100 persons. The unemployment rate decreased from 10.0% to 8.0% for the same time period.

# Youngstown

## Housing Unit Characteristics




**Owner-Occupied** - Sixty percent of the 28,400 occupied housing units in Youngstown were owner-occupied. Ninety-seven percent were free-standing houses. Eighty percent had 3 or more bedrooms. The median monthly housing costs for units with a mortgage was \$840. The median real estate taxes paid was \$550.




**Renter-Occupied** - Fifty-six percent of the renter-occupied units were free-standing houses. Eighty-two percent of the units had 2 or more bedrooms. The median monthly housing costs was \$500.

## Year Structure Built




The median year of construction for structures built in Youngstown was 1940 compared to the State's 1964. Over 18,000 of the 36,800 housing units were built prior to 1940 while 3,500 were built since 1970.

## Value of Owner-Occupied Housing



The median value of owner-occupied housing in Youngstown was \$52,500 compared to \$135,200 for Ohio. Nearly 94% of the 17,100 units were valued under \$100,000.

## Gross Rent



The median gross rent was \$500 for Youngstown, approximately \$130 below that of the State. Nearly one-third of the 11,300 rental units had rent between \$300 to \$499. There were 1,500 renter-occupied units with rent less than \$200.
