Community Development Infrastructure	The project focuses on activities directly related to community infrastructure such as property, buildings, or downtowns to support visible economic development and create vibrant communities. The applicant and partners have specific plans prepared to construct infrastructure necessary to revitalize the communities being served. The infrastructure aims to serve <u>multiple purposes</u> .	5
	The project includes a community infrastructure component, but applicants and partners do not have plans in place for specific activities focused on downtown revitalization or connecting communities through natural or cultural assets.	2
	The project does not include a community infrastructure component or other related activities.	0
Healthcare	The project clearly includes one or more activities directly related to increasing healthcare access or services and an established partnership with essential partners and providers in the healthcare industry is included.	3
	The project includes one or more healthcare components but lacks necessary healthcare partners and providers and/or a strategy to provide the resources needed to improve access or services to residents in the project area.	1
	The project does not include any health components.	0
Workforce	The project focuses on local or regional workforce development activities. The project has the support of, and partners with, employers and other key regional stakeholders. The project has identified specific workforce needs for the area being served.	2
	The project has components related to workforce development such as training or higher education but does not establish critical partnerships with employers. The applicant lacks direction in addressing specific workforce needs of the region.	1

These partners are engaged, have defined roles and the project will help expand those relationships. The partnerships are relevant to the project. The partners responsible for each activity are clearly stated.	10
	The project seeks to develop new public/private partnerships but does not expand upon existing or natural relationships. The partners responsible for each activity are clearly stated.	7
	The project develops partnerships but does not define how the new or existing partnerships are relevant to the project presented and does not clearly state partners responsible for each activity.	3
	The project does not include public/private partnerships.	0
Investment Priority: Evidence Based	The concept for the project has been proven and is based on strong evidence. Evidence, data, and/or a demonstrated successful similar project is presented or referenced directly in the application related to all project concepts.	10
	Part, but not all, of the project has been proven and is based on strong evidence.	7
	Anecdotal, high-level evidence on the general topic, such as a scholarly journal article on healthcare needs, has been provided in the application. However the proof of concept with evidence for the project is not demonstrated in the application.	3
	There is neither a proof of concept nor evidence supporting this project.	0
Investment Priority: Sustainability	The project provides a visible, lasting impact on the communities it serves and is sustainable for at least 20 years into the future. A sustainability plan is provided in the application.	10
	The project provides a visible, lasting impact on the communities and is sustainable, but the length of sustainability is less than 20 years or sustainability only covers a portion of the project. A sustainability plan is provided in the application.	7
	The project addresses elements of maintenance, but a sustainability plan is not provided in the application.	3
	The project does not demonstrate a visible or lasting impact or project maintenance and a sustainability plan is not provided in the application.	0
Economic Development: Quality of Life	The project demonstrates a comprehensive strategy and rationale to attract and retain people to the region, strengthen local business, and increase tourism.	5

	The project does not demonstrate an ability to attract and retain people to the region, strengthen local business, or increase tourism.	0
